Safety Briefing

Coursing is an athletic activity that can tax a dog's physical strength. Dogs that are overweight and/or out of condition may be at greater risk for injury and exhaustion. The inspection committee has the authority to disallow a dog's entry into a test and, in such instances, applicable entry fees will be refunded. At roll call, all dogs will be measured by a wicket to verify handicaps. Bitches in season, lame and unfit dogs will be excused. Please do not bring bitches in season to the test.

Entry Fee

**\$25.00 per entry per dog per test
(Includes \$3.50 AKC recording fee)**

Day of Test entries are **\$30.00** for each entry, and will close 30 minutes prior to roll call at the Field Trial Secretary's table. **Day of Test entries accepted as space allows.** If the trial has not filled, day of show entries will be accepted until 8:00AM. Closing date is September 21, 2019, no cancellations refunded after the closing date. All cancellations are subject to \$2.00 processing fee per entry. **Incomplete, unsigned, or conditional entries will not be accepted.** Entries are accepted online at sugarloafmountainracing.com or by USPS mail. Online entries are preferred with instant entry confirmation by email and will have an additional \$0.50 processing fee added per entry. All paper entries will be acknowledged by email if legible email address is provided in entry form.

Conditions of Entry

Dogs must have an AKC registration number and be at least one year of age on the day of the trial. Dogs may only run once per test. One dog per entry form per test. All entries must be accompanied with a check to be valid. A returned check is not a valid entry. There will be a \$35 fee for a returned check. Entries received by phone, text, or email will not be accepted. Incomplete entries or forms without signature will not be accepted.

Fast CAT events are open to all dogs at least 12 months of age that are individually registered with the AKC, recorded in the Foundation Stock Service (FSS) program, individually registered with a foreign or domestic registry organization whose pedigrees are acceptable for AKC registration, dogs granted a Purebred Alternative Listing (PAL) number, dogs with AKC Limited or Conditional Registration, or dogs enrolled in the AKC Canine Partners program. Dogs with breed disqualifications and monorchid/cryptorchid dogs are eligible to participate.

At roll call, all dogs will be examined for disqualifications. Bitches known to be in season are not to be brought to the test. At inspection, bitches in season, lame and unfit dogs will be excused.

Hours

Grounds will be available no later than one hour prior to trial hours. NTC will do its best to accommodate exhibitors with conflicts in other venues, if any. However, exhibitors must notify the Field Trial Secretary of possible conflicts and must work their dog into the running order during the regular test schedule. It is also the responsibility of each entrant to try to be ready when their dog is called to the line.

Trial Hours

Wednesday and Thursday: 9:00AM until 3:00PM or all runs are completed.

Roll Call

You may check in for inspection 30 minutes prior to the beginning of each trial, or throughout the event. Every dog must pass through roll call inspection before running. Dogs who miss roll call will be skipped, not marked absent immediately, and the next dog will be called to the line.

Prizes

NTC will offer a light blue flat ribbon for a passing qualifying run. NTC will offer placement rosettes at each trial for:

- Fastest 1st-4th in under 12" class
- Fastest 1st-4th in 12" to 18" class
- Fastest 1st-4th in 18" or greater class

NTC will have a limited number of title rosettes available. Please notify the trial secretary, via email or include with your entry form, if you will be earning the titles to ensure that the club will have rosettes available.

What is the Fast CAT?

Fast CAT is a timed straight 100-yard dash for dogs. Dogs are held at the start line and the coursing lure is activated prompting the dog to follow chasing it to the finish line and into a catch pen. The course is completely fenced and dogs are run individually. Dogs are timed when they complete the 100-yard dash. The time is converted to Miles Per Hour (MPH).

FORMULA: $204.545 / \text{RUN TIME} = \text{MPH}$

$\text{MPH} \times \text{HANDICAP} = \text{POINTS (ROUNDED TO NEAREST 0.01)}$

Based on the dog's size at the withers a handicap is applied and points are earned:

- 18" or greater = Handicap is 1.0
- 12" up to less than 18" = Handicap is 1.5.
- Below 12" = Handicap is 2.0.

MPH X HANDICAP = POINTS

Titles are earned at specific point levels and the highest suffix may appear after the dog's name:

BCAT = 150 points

DCAT = 500 points

FCAT = 1,000 points

FCAT# = Each additional 500 points

Top 20 by Breed by Year

The AKC Fast CAT website will feature the Top 20 fastest dogs by breed. Dogs must complete at least 3 qualifying runs in each calendar year to qualify for the Top 20. The standings will be updated as event results are processed at https://www.apps.akc.org/apps/fastcat_ranking

Trial Site Directions

From the North

(Northern New Jersey/New York/Wilkes Barre/Scranton)

Interstate 78 West to Interstate 81 South to Exit 29a Route 934 South to Route 322 West to Route 117 North.

Turn right on Airport Road.

From the South

(Baltimore/York)

Interstate 83 North to Route 322 At Harrisburg to Route 322 East to Route 117 North.

Turn right on Airport Road.

From the East

(Southern New Jersey/Philadelphia/Reading)

Pennsylvania Turnpike (Interstate 76) West to Exit 266 to Route 72 North to Route 322 West to Route 117 North.

Turn right on Airport Road.

From the West

(Ohio/Pittsburgh/Carlisle)

Pennsylvania Turnpike (Interstate 76) East to Exit 266 to Route 322 East to Route 117 North.

Turn right on Airport Road.

Notice To All Exhibitors

All exhibitors must be responsible for cleaning up after their dogs on the motel, RV and trial grounds. Motels require that dogs be crated when unattended. Any damages to motels, RV sites or the trial site can result in disciplinary action by the Event Committee. It is expected that exhibitors will clean up immediately after their own dogs and strongly encourage others to do the same. All owners/exhibitors should be aware that the entire motel grounds and RV sites are considered within the trial grounds. You will be responsible for all damage to your room/site and may be subject to disciplinary action in accordance with the rules of the AKC. Any abuse of the grounds will be brought to the attention of the trial-giving club and its Event Committee. Any exhibitor's entries may be refused for previous misuse of the motel or RV facilities. This is an AKC supported measure.

NTC Trial Information

- Dogs should be warmed up before and cooled down after running.
- **ALL DOGS RUN AT OWNER'S SOLE RISK**
- All entries must be 12 months of age or older on the day of the test.
- All AKC rules regarding sportsmanship and conduct apply.
- This is a rain-or-shine outdoor event. Please plan accordingly. Please bring your own shade, chairs and water.
- An electronic timing system will be used. An electric, continuous loop, plastic strip lure machine will be used.
- The show grounds are not completely fenced. The FAST CAT course will be fenced.
- On site bathrooms are available.
- Dogs must be on lead or crated unless running.
- **A \$5 fine will be assessed for any loose dog on the field not competing, or an exhibitor caught not picking up after their dog.**
- You are responsible for controlling your dog(s) and children.
- Each dog requires an individual entry form for each event in which it is entered.
- Bitches in season and lame dogs will be excused. **Entry fees will be refunded.**
- The Huntmaster is responsible for field safety and therefore he/she is in complete charge of all dogs and handlers on the field. In service to this

responsibility, he/she has the authority to stop the lure in any potentially dangerous situation and signal the handler to retrieve the dog on the course.

- Persons exhibiting conduct detrimental to the AKC/NTC/any dog(s)/other person(s) will be asked to leave the trial site by the Field Committee, maybe disciplined by the AKC, and **entry fees will not be refunded.**
- **No entry fees will be refunded** if the event cannot be started or completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, extreme and/or dangerous weather conditions, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of In the Net.
- Norfolk Terrier Club, its agents, members, representatives, volunteers, etc., assume no liability or responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors, handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children or spectators before, during, or after this event.

Course Map



Red box is approximately the length of the entire course. Dogs will run 100 yards with 40-yard finish area past the finish line. Course will be fenced in. Yellow circle is the exit door from the main building. Pink box and orange circle will be the check-in areas. **No parking permitted on the grass anywhere on the property. You must park in the parking lot and not block RV access.**
